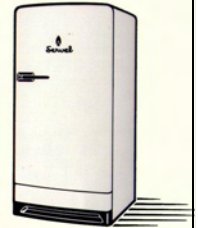
Our next meeting is on 4th November 2013 at St. Stephens Church Hall, Old Forest Road, Lugarno commencing at 8.00pm sharp.

Hurstville Council happenings...

- **Fridge Buyback Program** - HCC is an active participant in the NSW Govt. Fridge Buyback program. Over the past 12 months, Hurstville residents have given up 973 fridges and freezers and saved \$291,900 in power bills. Fridge Buyback recycle the metal and de-gas the appliances, saving on landfill and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
- **Removal of Parking Metres in Treacy Street** - New 3 hour (3P) signage has been erected in the area and will be enforced from 14 Oct. 2013.
- **Toilet at Hurstville Transport Interchange** - HCC is currently finalizing prices and designs for the new toilet facility at Hurstville Transport Interchange. It is anticipated the contract will be awarded in Oct. 2013 with a view to commence preliminary works in early Nov. 2013.
- Approximately 35% of Stage 2 Peakhurst Light Industrial Stormwater Harvesting and Reuse Scheme is now complete.
- **Revenue Works**—HCC is liaising with "Adshel" on the installation of a new bus shelter at Forest Road, Lugarno. The design for the concrete platform and access paths are in progress. Changes to the playground equipment at Cedar Street Reserve are scheduled to commence in Nov. 2013.
- **Biodiversity Study for Hurstville Local Govt. Area** - HCC has sought quotes for the completion of a biodiversity study for the Hurstville local government area. The study will identify threatened species and endangered ecological communities, habitat corridors and other remnant vegetation and current threats to existing species and communities.
- HCC has been working with Planet Footprint to improve the way it records and reports its energy and water consumption. Reporting will now include detailed case studies of Council's top five energy consumption sites to assist in identifying trends in usage and develop actions to reduce consumption.
- **New Signage at Myles Dunphy Reserve** - describing the environmental significance of Myles Dunphy Reserve and Wetlands and Plan of Management for the reserve has been installed at three locations at the site. The signs also include maps of the reserve's walking tracks with "you are here" place finders.

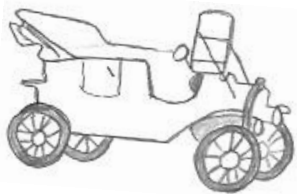
